Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome to Term 2. It's promised to be another busy period as we see out 2016.

First of all we would like to thank you all for your very generous donations for this year's Harvest. We managed to gather a large amount of food to donate to those less fortunate.

Literacy & Numeracy

In Literacy pupils will be starting a new unit on poetry. By the end of the unit, children will be writing a free verse poem about an unexpected event. Having examined key features, the expectation will be to use the following features such as: rhyme and rhythm, similes and metaphors, haiku and couplets.

In Numeracy, pupils are now grouped into ability sets. There are 5 sets: teachers will differentiate the work to meet the needs of the pupils in their classes. This term, pupils will be focusing on multiplication and divisional facts.

Topic : The Romans are coming....

They came, they saw, they conquered.

Every term we learn about a different topic. We make cross-curricular links with these topics which allows the lessons to be taught in a creative way. This term the topic in Year 4 is '**The Romans**'. This is an historical based topic looking at where, when and why the Romans invaded Britain. It looks at how the Romans lived and the impact the Romans had on different people's lives.

We are pleased to say that we will have an expert on the Roman army visit us in school on the 7th December to show the children how the army were disciplined. The children will also have the opportunity to re-enact different soldier formations they would have used in battle, wearing copies of the Roman armour. The children will also have the opportunity to make some Roman bread.



The rest of the year 4 curriculum this term will consist of:

- **PHSE:** Making rules and laws.
- **R.E:** Why is the Bible important to Christians?
- **P.E:** Football (taught by Mr Griffin) and Swimming (East Ham Leisure Centre).

Homework

Homework is handed out on Thursday and is expected in on the following Tuesday. It is essential that the work is returned on the designated day, so as to give the teacher the opportunity to mark the work and give constructive feedback. If your child experiences difficulties in understanding and completing their homework, they should approach their class teacher before the work is due in.

Children will be given spellings and a short comprehension to complete every week. We will be giving the children time in class to learn these but please help your child memorise these for the Friday test and encourage use of them in their sentences.



Developing reading skills is a vital part of your child's education and an on-going form of homework, so we ask that you read with your child for at least 15 minutes each day and keep a record of it in their school diaries.

Times tables still need to be continually practiced at home and at school. While out and about with your child please play times tables games to help your child achieve their bronze, silver and gold badges.

P.E / Swimming Kits

Physical Education is a part of the National Curriculum and it is compulsory for pupils to participate. Therefore, it is necessary for children to have their P.E kit in school on the appropriate days. It is advisable that children leave their P.E kits in school (on their pegs) during term time and only take them home during the holidays to wash. Please ensure that your child has the relevant P.E kit .
