
Dear Parents/Carers,

Targets




Children have now been given target cards to complete to help with their learning. Literacy and maths target cards are kept in their exercise books so they can be frequently checked.

Literacy Target: Children are to create and describe characters and settings in a story in greater detail.

Maths Targets: Counting on and back. Learning how to tell the time using both analogue and digital clocks. Solving problems involving fractions and decimals.

Homework

Homework is handed out on Thursday and is expected in by the following Tuesday. It is essential that the work is returned by the designated day, so as to give the teacher the opportunity to mark the work and give constructive feedback. If your child experiences difficulties in understanding and completing their homework, they should approach their class teacher before the work is due in.



Children will be given spellings and a short comprehension to complete every week. We will be giving the children time in class to learn these but please help your child memorise these for the test on Friday and encourage the use of them in their sentences.

Developing reading skills is a vital part of your child's education and an on-going form of homework, so we ask that you read with your child for at least 15 minutes each day and keep a record of it in their school diaries.

P.E / Swimming Kits

Physical Education is a part of the National Curriculum and it is compulsory for pupils to participate. Therefore, it is necessary for children to have their P.E kits in school on the appropriate days. It is advisable that children leave their P.E kits in school (on their pegs) during term time and only take them home during the holidays to wash. Please ensure that your child has the relevant P.E kit.

Year 4 classes continue swimming on Mondays (4G) and Fridays. Please ensure that your child has their swimming kit with them on the relevant days. As well as an appropriate swim wear children are also required to bring in a swimming cap and a towel. Swimming caps can also be purchased from the school's main reception.

Ways Forward

- When picking up your child from school please ask them what they have done during the day. This is a very simple task to improve memory and chronological skills.
- When reading stories with your child, encourage them to predict what is going to happen next. Ask your child to re-write different parts of the story.
- Times tables still need to be continually practiced at home and at school. While out and about with your child please play times tables games to help your child achieve their bronze, silver and gold badges. Our expectations are that every child in Year 4 has, at least their bronze badge by the end of the current academic year.
