#### Health and Safety Reminders

We are experiencing an increasing number of pupils who are not being supervised appropriately before the start of the school day. This poses a serious health and safety risk as there have been occasions where children have left the premises to go to a shop or to meet up with a friend on the street. May I remind parents that it is **their** responsibility to ensure their child goes into the classroom/school building. If you drive to school, you must park the car where it is safe to do so and walk your child to their classroom, hall (breakfast club) or to the designated entry point for their classroom. At Vicarage, children can go to class from 8:45am. Bells are rung at 8:50am in the playground and all children must be in class for 8:55am at the latest.

Please help the school to make sure your child does not miss valuable learning time by bringing them on time every day.

May I remind parents that spitting on the ground in the playground is a serious health and safety risk as it causes spread of infections. Please refrain from doing this for the safety of our pupils and staff.
