On 28<sup>th</sup> April 2018, Vicarage Primary School hosted six Romanian delegates as part of their SEND Overseas Links Programme. Hosting this visit were the Head Teacher at Vicarage Primary School Shabana Khan, Revd Quintin Peppiatt (Chair of Governors), the SEND team at Vicarage - Shelly Ann Clunis (AHT/Inclusion Lead), Paulo Leal (SENCO) and Roxana Vasiloiu (Specialist Teacher for Dyslexia). In attendance were Miron Golasie (Principal of Simeria Veche Special School), Michael Mednick and other staff from Simeria Veche Special School. The day's schedule consisted of the delegates being welcomed by the Head Teacher, Chair of Governors and Inclusion Team with an initial overview of SEND provision at Vicarage. The delegates were able to see various sessions including Colourful Semantics, Dynamo Maths, Turnabout, Language Enrichment groups, Social Communication, Sensory Room and Attention Autism activities. They were also able to enjoy lunch in the dinner hall speaking to staff and pupils about being in a large primary school in Newham. The visitors commented on the excellent practice at the school, the dedicated and skilled staff and said it was a wonderful experience.

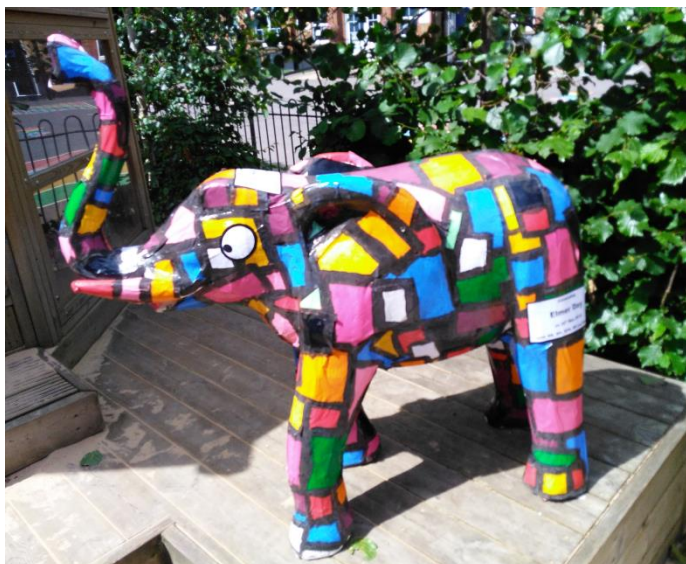

Vicarage Primary School is proud, once again, to be taking part in the Newham Carnival Festival. The theme this year is The Circus Cavalcade. Our children will be participating by creating props and will perform at the event. We look forward to seeing many of you cheering us on in the parade.

This year's parade will be extra special as it will be Mrs King's last year taking part before she retires. She has given a lot of time and dedication in helping colleagues to organise the day and has been attending the carnival for many years.

The University of East London will be showcasing an exhibition called Art Matters later this term with work by children from primary and secondary schools in Newham. We are delighted to be sharing art work by children at Vicarage. Children from the Years 3 and 4 Art Club will be visiting the exhibition, to attend a workshop along with seeing their work on display.

### Attendance and Punctuality Reminder

Can we remind parents and carers that:

All children are expected to attend school regularly and on time. We ask you to ensure your child is in school at **8:45am**, as this is the time children are able to gain entry to class. This gives them time to hang up their coat and say hello to their friends and be ready to start learning from the start of the school day, which is **8:55am**. If your child arrives just 5 minutes late each day, they will be missing nearly 16 hours education over the course of a school year. Children arriving late miss important information at the start of the lesson. They are often embarrassed by continual lateness and this can affect their self-esteem. Our school gates are locked promptly at **9:00am**. Children arriving after this time must report to the school office to get their registration mark. You will be asked to provide a reason for your child's lateness.

Please consider carefully if your child needs to take a day off school. Missing areas of the curriculum will leave gaps in their education which has a negative impact on progress and attainment.

- Make arrangements for travel during school holiday times.
- Where possible, medical appointments should be outside of school hours. You must provide medical evidence to cover such appointments.
- Please contact us if your child is absent.

Children who are persistently late to school or persistently collected late can become a safeguarding concern which may result in a referral to the Local Authority Social Care team.
