### Multi-Academy Trust School Council Event

### 'Respect For All' Conference

On Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> March 2018 ten schools in Newham came together for a conference organised by RE Today held at Plashet Secondary School.

The day saw 90 pupils come together to work and find out how we can show respect to others. The conference was packed full of inspirational learning and activities which the pupils fully engaged with. Representing Vicarage Primary School were 6 pupils and Mrs Ali, who is the RE leader for the school. Mrs Ali said "it was a very engaging and enjoyable day and the children learnt about respect and tolerance".

After a morning full of discussion and debate, the pupils went on to learn about what different religions and world views teach about how we should treat other human beings. In the afternoon the pupils then went on to design and create the message they wanted to say about respect.

### Autism Awareness Week 23<sup>rd</sup> - 27<sup>th</sup> April 2018

At Vicarage Primary School we are proud to have a diverse community representing different faiths and cultures as well as individual needs and abilities. There are a number of pupils in our school with special educational needs, the majority of whom are on the Autistic spectrum. Autism is a condition that affects how an individual communicates with and relates to other people, as well as how they experience the world around them. To support our work in raising awareness of ASD, we have organised a number of events. They include assemblies for pupils, various class activities and a workshop for parents on Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> April at 9:00am. We hope you will be able to attend.

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As part of our work to celebrate and value all cultures and traditions, on **Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> April** we will be celebrating St. George's Day. Children and staff can wear red, white and blue clothing to mark this special day.

### School Site Security Update

To ensure our school premises are safe and secure for both staff and pupils, the front entrance gate is now closed during school hours. To gain access, you must press the bell/buzzer and a member of staff will check before authorising entry onto the site.

Pupils who attend breakfast club can do so from **7:30am** when the gates will be opened.

At the end of the school day you are able to access the grounds from **3:00pm**. Please collect your child promptly as children become worried and distressed when they are not collected on time. The end of the school day is **3:15pm**. School gates are locked at **3:30pm**.

After school clubs finish at **4:20pm**. If your child is attending an after school club they must be collected in the KS1 playground at **4:20pm**.

Our Summer Term after school clubs will start week beginning **30<sup>th</sup> April 2018**.

### Attendance and Punctuality Reminder

Can we remind parents and carers that:

All children are expected to attend school regularly and on time. We ask you to ensure your child is in school at **8:45am**, as this is the time children are able to gain entry to class. This gives them time to hang up their coat and say hello to their friends and be ready to start learning from the start of the school day, which is **8:55am**. If your child arrives just 5 minutes late each day, they will be missing nearly 16 hours education over the course of a school year. Children arriving late miss important information at the start of the lesson. They are often embarrassed by continual lateness and this can affect their self-esteem. Our school gates are locked promptly at **9:00am**. Children arriving after this time must report to the school office to get their registration mark. You will be asked to provide a reason for your child's lateness.

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Please consider carefully if your child needs to take a day off school. Missing areas of the curriculum will leave gaps in their education which has a negative impact on progress and attainment.

- Make arrangements for travel during school holiday times.
- Where possible, medical appointments should be outside of school hours. You must provide medical evidence to cover such appointments.
- Please contact us if your child is absent.

Children who are persistently late to school or persistently collected late can become a safeguarding concern which may result in a referral to the Local Authority Social Care team.
