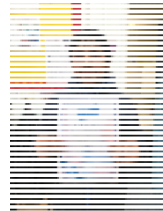

If you are interested and would like your child to attend our Breakfast Club, please contact the Extended School Lead, Mrs Begum in the school office.

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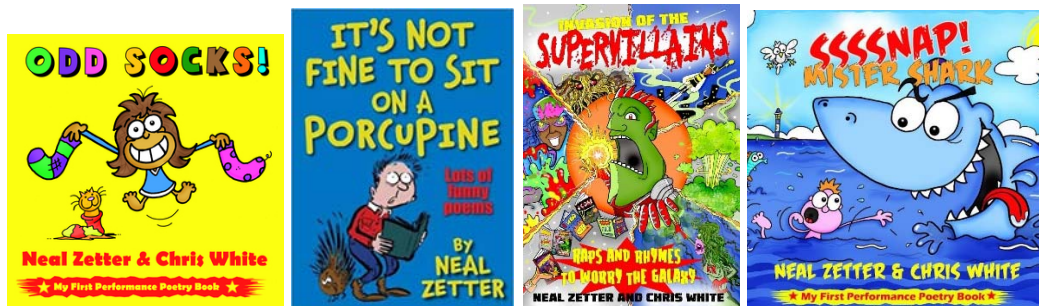
WORLD BOOK DAY

Author visit:

Neal Zetter, an author and poet, will be visiting the school that day. He will be performing his poems in assembly and delivering fun workshops. Here are some of the engaging books he has published. Children will have the opportunity to purchase books and have them signed by the author himself.
