





Look at the key workers - we are thankful for them, I admire them for helping us.


Having life is nice but we all love each other, I could learn from it - follow the rules and not to do bad things.


Nusaybah and her sister Sara had lots of fun creating prints using potatoes. They also created a video. Here is what they had to say.
